The In2Uni Program is designed: "To lift educational aspirations, build academic capacity and encourage students to explore the possibilities and opportunities beyond school"

The aims of In2Uni are to:

1. Develop, foster and sustain mutually beneficial collaborations and partnerships with key stakeholders;

2. Build aspirations of low SES communities and individuals towards Higher Education;

3. Build capacity to successfully navigate pathways to Higher Education; and

4. Strengthen relationships with parents and local communities to build an awareness and knowledge about Higher Education.

University Preparation Program

Target group: Under-performing Year 12 students from schools on the NSW South Coast and Southern Highlands from Eden to Wollongong





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UPP What is it and how does it work?

The University Preparation Program is designed to give Year 12 students an advantage in their HSC. Over two school terms, students will receive assistance with their HSC subjects through an on campus study centre at one of UOW's campuses, have access to UOW resources including the library, and receive advice on study skills and mentoring to discuss their options after they finish high school.

On successful completion of the University Preparation Program, students will receive an admissions interview to the University of Wollongong.

Students will be expected to complete:

• 30 hours of tutoring across the 20 weeks, with a minimum of 24 hours tutoring required for successful completion of the program.

Face to face tutoring will be supplemented and supported by the following:

- Twenty on-line study skills and university familiarisation modules. Completion of all modules will be compulsory for successful completion of the program.
- Additional holiday activities e.g. mock exam day, mock interview day (note these activities will not count towards minimum 24 hour tutoring requirement)
- Online discussion boards monitored by mentors for ongoing study support

UPP: Review and Student Stories

Is it working? How do you know?

- 2015 an evaluation report was produced about UPP
- Key results: Objective and substantial improvements in outcomes for UPP students relative to the comparison population
- Students explained the impact of UPP in relationship to increasing in knowledge and understanding about options for the future
- Mentor relationship critical
- Insight into what next: Parent engagement and managing expectations- 2016 Parent Seminar Series
- This year we have just shy of 400 students across our locations
